Choose one of the following two scenarios.

SCENARIO 1: Society

Last summer you got the opportunity to spend a month living with a French family. On your return you were asked to write an account of your experience, in **French**, for your school/college website.

You must include the following information and **you should try to add** other relevant details:

- where exactly you went **and** what you thought of the town
- how you got on with the family
- what you did to improve your French
- what you found most difficult about your stay
- how you benefitted from your stay
- whether or not you would live with a French family again.

You should write approximately 150–180 words.

OR

SCENARIO 2: Learning

Last July, you spent two weeks in France at a language school. On your return you have been asked to write an account, in **French**, of your experience for the language school website.

You must include the following information and **you should try to add** other relevant details:

- where the language school was situated **and** where you stayed for the two weeks
- what you thought of the accommodation
- what you did during the day at the language school
- what you did in the evenings
- how you benefitted from your studies
- whether or not you would consider doing a similar course in the future.

You should write approximately 150–180 words.
