Choose **one** of the following two scenarios.

SCENARIO 1: Culture

Last summer you went to a film festival in Italy with your school/college. You have been asked to write about your experience, in **Italian**, for the language section of your school/college website.

You must include the following information and **you should try to add** other relevant details:

- where the film festival took place **and** how you travelled there
- what you thought of the films you saw
- what else you did during your stay in Italy
- what you liked or disliked about the Italian way of life
- ways in which you used your Italian
- whether you would recommend a trip to Italy to other people.

You should write approximately 150–180 words.

OR

SCENARIO 2: Learning

Last year you went on an exchange trip to a school/college in Italy. On your return you write about your experience, in **Italian**, for the language section of its website.

You must include the following information and **you should try to add** other relevant details:

- where exactly you went **and** how you travelled
- what a typical day in the school/college was like
- how you got on with the other students
- what your accommodation was like
- what trips you went on
- what you intend to do when your Italian friend visits Scotland next year.

You should write approximately 150–180 words.
